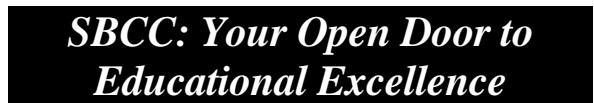
Jobs and a preferred lifestyle are what inspire most students to enter Santa Barbara City College's Environmental Horticulture Program. The department offers a *one-year Certificate in Environmental Horticulture* as well as a *two-year degree with six areas of emphasis* to choose from.

"Learn by doing" is the program's philosophy. Practical labs, cooperative work study and apprentice training are heavily integrated into the program.

Careers in Environmental Horticulture

A major in Environmental Horticulture can lead to careers in landscape contracting (C-27 license), maintenance contracting, landscape design, nursery/greenhouse technologies, turf care, urban forestry/arboriculture, irrigation specialist, xeriscaping, integrated pest management, park administration, edible and production horticulture, floriculture and floristry, estate/grounds management, horticulture business management, green resource recycling, biodiversity, conservancy and sustainable horticulture, plus many more.

Graduation Requirements: (1) Complete all department requirements with a grade of C or higher in each course; (2) Complete at least 18 units of General Education Requirements (Areas A-D of the SBCC General Education pattern); (3) Complete the Institutional Requirements (Area E); (4) Complete the Information Competency Requirement (Area F); (5) Complete a total of 60 degree-applicable units (SBCC courses numbered 100 and higher); (6) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all units attempted at SBCC; and (7) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all college units attempted. Candidates for an Associate Degree are expected to complete 45 units at SBCC, or complete the last 15 units in residence at SBCC. Candidates for an Associate Degree are also expected to complete at least 20% of the department requirements in residence at SBCC. Pass/no pass grading is not permitted in a course within a student's major area of study.
