HEPATITIS B IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

The Health Technologies Office strongly recommends its students undergo the Hepatitis B vaccination series. The Hepatitis B vaccination is a series of three injections. The second injection is given one month after the first, with the third injection five months later. The series, therefore, takes six months to complete. If you decide to forego the immunization, you will be required to sign a declination form indicating you understand the risks involved for those who are not immunized.
