

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
WESTERN UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES, COLLEGE OF PHARMACY
AND
SANTA BARBARA CITY COLLEGE
AUGUST 2022

1. Western University of Health Sciences, College of Pharmacy (WesternU) and Santa Barbara City College (SBCC) hereby enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to establish a linkage program, to be known as the SBCC/WesternU Community College Accelerated Pharmacy Pathway (CCAPP).
2. The SBCC/WesternU CCAPP is designed for pre-pharmacy students at SBCC who wish to secure Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) as candidates for the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree at WesternU.
3. Students may follow the pathway in the following manner:
 - a. SBCC shall establish a pathway that will allow interested students to complete all the required prerequisites in a preferred two-year period. The list of required prerequisites, as outlined in Attachment A, will be communicated annually to the designated liaison at SBCC.
 - b. Students must complete all required prerequisites with a minimum total grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 in these courses in order to be eligible for WesternU CCAPP TAG admission.
 - c. Students will ordinarily apply for acceptance to WesternU in the academic year prior to their intended WesternU matriculation.
 - d. Prior to enrollment at WesternU, prospective SBCC/WesternU CCAPP students will complete an interview with WesternU.
4. When a student accepts admission to the SBCC/WesternU CCAPP, they will authorize SBCC to provide what information WesternU requires, as permitted by FERPA, to determine continued student eligibility.
5. Final acceptance decisions will be made by WesternU admissions. The criteria for TAG acceptance to WesternU PharmD program via CCAPP shall be as follows:
 - a. Completion of all prerequisite coursework with a grade of C or better.
 - b. Prerequisite course work completed to date with a GPA of at least 3.0. Grades from all institutions attended must be included (if required).
 - c. Supportive letters of reference from the liaison at SBCC, and one additional science faculty member and/or a pharmacist.
 - d. Submission of a PharmD application through Pharmacy College Application Service (PharmCAS) no later than January 1 of the year of intended matriculation at WesternU. Submission of secondary application materials as requested by WesternU.
 - e. Evidence of suitability for the health care professions, as indicated by (1) a disciplinary record entirely free of proven violations of standards of student conduct, and (2) a successful interview at WesternU.
6. Upon receipt of acceptance to the WesternU PharmD program, candidates have two weeks in which to notify WesternU of intent to enroll.
7. The term of this MOU will be for five (5) years, beginning on the date of the last signature of the parties authorized to execute this MOU. Either party may terminate this MOU by giving written notice to the other party at least 90 days prior to the first date of the new academic semester. This MOU will continue to apply to students who were enrolled in the SBCC/WesternU CCAPP program specified in this MOU prior to the date of the termination.
8. This MOU is the complete agreement between the parties. The MOU may be amended only with the mutual written consent of both parties.

Each party to the MOU shall be responsible according to applicable local, state and federal laws for the acts or omissions of its own employees, officers, agents, or assigns in performance of this MOU. Neither party to this Agreement shall be considered the agent of the other, nor does either party assume any responsibility for the consequences of any act or omission of any person or entity not party to this MOU.
