This is an exciting opportunity to gain professional experience working for a leader in California public sector land use planning and environmental regulation. The City of Santa Barbara Planning Division will be filling two intern positions in Long Range Planning. The Long Range Planning Division develops and implements goals, policies, and action plans related to

community issues such as housing, land use, growth management, resource conservation, open space, transportation, and circulation, and is responsible for preparing and updating the state mandated General Plan. Specific assignments will be related to the Housing Element Update and the applicant's area of study and interest. It is anticipated that approximately 75% of the work will be done outside the office environment. Interested candidates must be willing to work outside walking multiple blocks in the City.

Qualifications & Compensation: To participate in the program students must be a second year in a Community College or in University with a focus in urban and regional planning, environmental studies, geography, GIS, or related field with a minimum 3.0 G.P.A. Preference will be given to students who can commit 10-15 hours a week to the position. Compensation will be \$15 per hour but no benefits can be offered. This internship provides valuable experience in public sector community planning.

Work as a team to conduct on the ground neighborhood surveys of housing stock conditions;

Analyze land use, zoning, and policy issues;

Prepare maps, graphics, and documents for publishing in hard copy and on the City website;

Provide logistical support for public meetings and workshops; and
