Colleagues, sharing the updated regulations regarding credit certificates. The impact to your offices includes the fact that more certificates may be submitted for approval that will be eligible for federal student aid (i.e. Pell Grants). Some colleges are already disbursing aid to students in programs of 16 or 17 units, without express approval from the Chancellor's Office (CO), but many colleges have been hesitant to disburse aid to these students without the CO approval. The larger impact with be felt in the general apportionment funding formula. Districts will only get "points" for CO approved programs. As a result your college/district may be submitting more programs for CO approval then you have submitted in the past. Please let me know if you have any questions.

# BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGES PROPOSED REVISIONS TO TITLE 5 REGULATIONS:

# CREDIT CERTIFICATES

1. Section 550701 of article 7 of subchapter 1 of chapter 6 of division 6 of title 5 of the California Code of Regulations is amended as follows:

§ 55070. Credit Certificates.

- (a) Any sequence of courses consisting of 18-16 or more semester units or 27-24 or more quarter units of degree-applicable credit coursework shall constitute an educational program subject to approval by the Chancellor pursuant to section 55130. The college-awarded document confirming that a student has completed such a program shall be known as a certificate of achievement and may not be given any other designation. The award of a certificate of achievement is intended to represent more than an accumulation of units. Listing of the certificate of achievement on a student transcript symbolizes successful completion of patterns of learning experiences designed to develop certain capabilities that may be oriented to career or general education; provided however, that no sequence or grouping of courses may be approved as a certificate of achievement pursuant to this section if it consists solely of basic skills and/or ESL courses. For purposes of this subdivision, the term "general education" includes coursework taken to satisfy transfer patterns established by the University of California, the California State University, or accredited public postsecondary institutions in adjacent states which award the baccalaureate degree.
- (b) Shorter credit programs leading to a certificate may be established without review and approval by the Chancellor after approval by the college curriculum committee and the district governing board. Such a certificate may be given any name or designation deemed appropriate by the district governing board, except that such a certificate may not be referred to as a certificate of achievement, a certificate of completion, or a certificate of competency, unless approved by the Chancellor pursuant to subdivision (c). Such a certificate may not be listed on a student's transcript, unless approved by the Chancellor pursuant to subdivision (c).
- (c) A district may submit any sequence of courses consisting of  $\frac{128}{2}$  or more semester units or  $\frac{18-12}{2}$  or more quarter units of degree-applicable credit coursework to the Chancellor and request that it be approved as a program leading to a certificate of achievement. The Chancellor may approve such a program if he or she determines that it satisfies the requirements of subdivision (a) despite requiring fewer than  $\frac{18-16}{27-24}$  quarter units of degree-applicable credit coursework.
- (d) Content and assessment standards for certificates shall be defined by the local curriculum committee and comply with the requirements of this chapter. Such standards should also ensure that certificate programs will be consistent with the mission of the

college, meet a demonstrated need, be feasible, and adhere to guidelines on academic integrity which may be developed by the Chancellor, the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges or other appropriate statewide bodies.

- (e) A description of each approved program shall be included in the college catalog.
- (f) The Chancellor shall develop forms and procedures for submission of applications for approval of a program leading to a certificate of achievement.
- (g) Provisions of this section regarding the naming or designation of certificates shall become effective for the Fall 2008 term.
