The Santa Barbara AEBG Consortium allocation for the Year-4 grant cycle is \$804,710.00. All awardees are expected to expend funds no later than September 1, 2020. The Consortium has historically awarded 70% or more of its total funding to programs.

A comprehensive and competitive Request for Proposal submission will align with the Adult Education Block Grant and the Consortium's Goals and Objectives set forth below.

The overarching AEBG 3-year plan goals of the Consortium are (1) to provide excellent programming for adults in a variety of program areas based on proven community needs; (2) to develop student support services specifically focused on the needs of adult learners, to assist in transfer acceleration and career success; (3) to support innovative professional development for staff and faculty; and (4) to set meaningful outcomes captured by various measurements and tools and shared with her stakeholders.

The Santa Barbara AEBG Consortium's primary goals for upcoming 2018-2019 year are the following:

- 1) Continue to support our noncredit faculty in building bridges to credit for existing and new AEBG programs.
- 2) Continue to fill gaps in Career Education in Industrial Technologies (or other areas supported by the study currently underway to be completed by 2018).
- 3) Support new activity resulting from AB705 implementation (focused on mathematics, English, and ESL).
- 4) Implement and support the new the Adults with Disabilities Career Planning and Training Program
- 5) Continue to partner with local Santa Barbara One-Stop operator and other agencies for career training initiatives.
- 6) Continue to cross-pollinate AEBG initiatives with WIOA and Strong Workforce initiatives.
- 7) Continue its commitment to the collection of accurate data and analytics for all AEBG programs and services
- 8) Continue to support our Student Support Services to help transition students from noncredit to credit or jobs/careers.
- 9) Continue to support our existing SBCC programs that are aligned with the AEBG goals and initiatives.
- 10) Support job placement assistance efforts where feasible and allowable

- Programs in elementary and secondary basic skills, including programs leading to a high school diploma or high school equivalency certificate.
- Programs for immigrants eligible for educational services in citizenship, English as a second language, and workforce preparation.

- Programs for adults with disabilities.
- Programs in career technical education that are short term in nature and have high employment potential.
- Programs offering pre-apprenticeship training activities conducted in coordination with one or more apprenticeship programs approved by the Division of Apprenticeship Standards for the occupation and geographic area.

1. Executive Summary *

Please provide an executive summary of your proposed plan (to include overarching goals and outcomes) to create new programs or expand existing programs in one of the areas identified above.

Building on the 2018-2019 pilot, this new Santa Barbara Public Library (SPBL) program will address the widespread need for improved Spanish literacy as a foundation for English as Second Language (ESL) learning. Through small classes, one-to-one-tutoring, and online literacy training learners will build the native language literacy necessary for subsequent success in ESL, vocational training, and full integration into the Santa Barbara community. Adult Education Block Grant (AEBG) funding will enable SBPL to build on our existing volunteer tutor model for English Literacy by hiring a certified ESL instructor and a specialist in Spanish language adult education from La Plaza Comunitaria to train additional bilingual volunteers in effective pre-ESL teaching strategies. Small pre-ESL classes will provide the opportunity to cultivate a cohort of learning peers. One-to-one tutoring will continue to provide flexibility in scheduling and allow tutors to meet individual learners where they are in their own unique learning processes. Access to online resources, like grant funded Leamos subscriptions and Pumarosa on our Literacy Center computers and devices, will further allow tutors to provide blended learning techniques and learners to build on their in-person training during their free time and at their own pace in selfstudy.

Many of our learners who would benefit from pre-ESL tutoring and training come to us because they are seeking greater access to employment opportunities. As such, pre-ESL is an essential first step to thriving in not only SB Public Library's Adult Literacy Program but also in the SBPL Works! workforce development program as well as in non-credit and credit courses at Santa Barbara City College (SBCC).

2. Integration *

Please explain how your proposed program creates a transition to credit/transfer educational programs or creates a transition to the workforce (including, but not limited to, internships, jobs, pre-apprenticeships, self-employment).

This project helps adult learners build the basic native language literacy skills necessary to excel in ESL learning and thereby increase achievement of a variety of goals including citizenship, improved employment options, and workforce reentry. Most of our Spanish speaking ESL learners are working and raising families so the time they can dedicate to building their language skills is limited and inconsistent. The varied formats of small class training, one-to-one tutoring, and online instruction will give the program the flexibility required to meet the specific needs of each learner and accommodate different learning styles and schedules. By building a foundation in literacy in Spanish reading, learners can more easily transition to ESL learning and English fluency, becoming fuller selves in their families and work and as members of the Santa Barbara community.

3. Justification *

Our primary objective is to meet the current demand for pre-ESL training with the long-term goal of permanently incorporating it into our Adult Literacy Program. We currently have a backlog of learners who require Spanish-speaking tutors to transition them into ESL learning. Because of our current program does not explicitly recruit and train bilingual tutors in pre-ESL strategies, committed learners languish on our waiting list and often lose interest before a successful tutor match is made. Developing a program that specifically addresses the struggles of learners in their native language first will help us more effectively move learners into our established ESL literacy program.

4. Outreach & Marketing *

Please describe your plans to conduct outreach and marketing to reach your target population and increase enrollments.

The target population for the pilot is Spanish speaking adults in Santa Barbara and surrounding communities who have struggled with ESL learning as a result of limited literacy in their native language. Spanish language and bilingual marketing efforts will include hanging flyers in local businesses, posting Spanish language videos on social media, ads in local Spanish language newspapers and radio stations, and in-person canvasing by bilingual staff in target neighborhoods. Additionally, we will coordinate and promote our program with the SBCC School of Extended Learning.

5. Alignment *

Please describe how your program is in alignment and furthers the Consortium's goals and objectives as stated above.

SBPL's pre-ESL pilot addresses the proven needs of the Spanish speaking adult immigrant population in our community and fulfills the California state initiative focusing on immigrant integration. The program also addresses AEBG's stated goals by (1) providing excellent programming by building on SBPL's successful English adult literacy model to address the needs of native Spanish speakers, (2) developing student support services specifically focused on adult learners to assist in transfer acceleration and career success by readying learners for the language acquisition necessary to succeed, (3) supporting innovative professional development for staff and faculty by providing training to address current pre-ESL needs of our community, and (4) setting meaningful outcomes by working with learners to set and achieve clear personal and professional goals. SBPL Adult Literacy Program's pre-ESL program will also build bridges to existing and new AEBG programs both within the Library and in the greater Santa Barbara community by filling in the gaps between services currently offered by SBPL, SBCC credit division, the School of Extended Learning, and other agencies.

Yes. While SBPL does not receive additional funds specifically for pre-ESL programs, the Adult Literacy Program receives additional funding from the California State Library, Family Service Agency and the City of Santa Barbara.

What is your sustainability plan for this activity when funding is no longer available? *

The project relies on a successful model of adult literacy volunteer tutoring that has operated for 30 years, by providing increased support for training, this pre-ESL project increases capacity for both volunteers and staff. The AEBG funds provided initial training and staff to enable the program to improve instruction, serve additional adult learners, and replicate the new pre-ESL tutor training in years to come.
