 - Over 1,000 students on probation now
 - Fall 2015 1, 213 are on academic and progress probabion
 - 716 students dismissed in Spring 16
 - 336 students reinstated based on their appeals -- themes of the appeals were (1) they are working xx hours per week and (2) family emergency / emergency situations ... they all promised not to let us down... they just need the nudge...

 - Our IEPI Framework is at misweb.ccco.edu/ie
 - Here are the goals we declared and certified last year
 - Ending Fund Balances as Percentage of total expenditures
 - Goal: 20% Actual: TBD but we will easily meet this
 - Successful Course Completion declared goal for Fall 2015
 - Goal: 75.8% Actual: 73.1% (source: Datamart) needs attention
 - We need to declare and certify Year 2 required goals by June 15, 2016
 - Successful Course Completion rate is falling slightly need to unpack and analyze
- 3. Review SBCC Institution-Set Standards (Required by ACCJC)
 - Needs updating for Fall 2015
- 4. Upcoming Research Projects (Jack and Cameron)
 - Identify the factors associated with or better yet predict whether or not students entering the college for the first time with a goal of certificate, degree and/or transfer persist from the first to second semester at the college and from the second to the third semester at the college.
 - Identify the factors that predict whether or not students will be placed on some form of academic progress probation or academic dismissal.
 This study will also include analyses of the factors related with the

success rates of students on academic disqualification who re-entered the college after being suspended from the attending college for a semester and those who were given permission by Ben to stay enrolled at the college.

Notes:

Discussion of Multiple Measures pilot: current status, progress, etc. Issue: not getting as many matches as anticipated with the CalPASS data

Grant: currently working on a Basic Skills Progress grant. Could some money be made available for MMAP? Jack will talk to Elmore about it - perhaps the Math Boot Camps.

Discuss overall IEPI framework, purpose, goals, planning. \$150K available.

Successful Course Completion rate goal for Fall 2016: discussion, and decision to use the 5-year trailing average (73.8%), this will be our recommendation to CPC.

Looked at Scorecard Math/English/ESL rates from previous cohort - declaration of goals. Choose the 8 goals. Look at the draft Scorecard with the 2009-10 cohort and Notice Math Remedial went down from 43.9% to 39.6%. So we chose the optional goal to be getting the Math Remedial rate back up to 43.9%.

Looked at Tableau historical rates, which track the Datamart rates suprisingly closely.

Jack's request to Jordan: look at course success rates over the past 3 falls, look at gatekeeper courses...

Discussed the research projects that Jack and Cameron have put forward

Discuss of students on disqual - how many come back and how do they do? Are counselor resources warranted.
