I believe that art has always been the way humanity finds itself into my heart. In my Mexican literature class I learned what aspirational capital is. This is the ability to maintain one's dreams and hopes amidst adversity. Most people seem to have a few difficulties in life to overcome. Mine is - I am a legally blind artist, Retinitis Pigmentosa, with Multiple sclerosis. Community colleges foster our aspirations. I find art and education irresistible and this is my aspirational capital. I loved reading about Ted Townsend; that he focused on what he loved.
