The biggest issue in California and Santa Barbara is cost of living, which SBCC is already doing an excellent job fighting with the Promise Program, EOPS, the Basic Needs Center, and other programs. I want to ensure these ventures continue and grow. Another issue is lack of adequate representation, which I am going to counter by improving information collection. I am the best candidate for this position because I work hard, care about people, work well with others, lead well, and listen well.
